

## Your Weekly Message from Fr. Norbert, CR

Greetings! I hope everyone had an enjoyable Easter Sunday as well as the days that surrounded this great celebration. Hopefully many of our parishioners were able to enjoy the


company of family and friends. Most especially I hope everyone was moved closer to our Risen Lord: the Resurrection was guite an event which gives us hope in our future because it expressed the tremendous love that God has for each one of us. Locally, during church services we tried to express this faith as a congregation. Our hearts were lifted up by the music, the choirs, and the cantors who led us in song and prayer. I am deeply thankful to the many volunteers who assisted all of us during this special time. I am thankful to Greg Hoffman for preparing the new fire to be blessed for the beginning of Holy Saturday night. I would be remiss if I forgot about the ushers, the mass coordinators, lectors, servers at mass, and in a very special way the members of the Art and Environment Committee led by Vicki Tuch who prepared the church and the gym for all of our celebrations. The readings of Holy Saturday evening relate the entirety of our salvation history from creation by God who freed His people when they were enslaved. Also these readings expressed God's continual patience when He sent prophets to guide His chosen people after they became a wayward people. Ultimately through Jesus, the Son of God, who walked upon the face of this

earth a new hope of salvation was given to humanity. Jesus came to lead us closer to holiness as well as to help us learn to love God and each other. Jesus offered Himself as a sacrifice for our salvation. He continues to do so in the Holy Eucharist. During the fifty days of this Easter Season before the celebration of Pentecost we will recall the activity of the Risen Lord after He was raised from the tomb. Jesus appearing to Mary at the site of the tomb; Jesus entering the room where the apostles were gathered together in fear; Jesus walking some seven miles with two of His disciples on the road toward Emmaus before they were able to recognize Him. This year Divine Mercy Sunday is also commemorated on this Second Sunday of Easter. As many of you may know the message of Divine Mercy is associated with a Polish nun who died in 1938. Her name is St. Maria Faustina Kowalska. Saint Faustina was a mystic. She received extraordinary experiences of the Lord Jesus while she was praying. In fact, Jesus appeared to her and even spoke directly with her. Many of our parishioners follow her devotions to the Heart of our Lord Jesus. May we too take the time to pray to our Lord Jesus. May the joy of the Risen Lord Jesus be with you and your family and friends during this Easter Season.

"The following prayerfully submitted by MAC:

"I went to a Catholic school taught by nuns. I was in fourth grade when I received my First Eucharist. I don't recall knowing that the Holy Eucharist was the True Presence of our Lord's Body and Blood. I do know that as I got older, I came to know how much God was in my life, and how much He helped me through life. By having God in my life and by studying the Bible, I learned the true meaning of the Holy Eucharist.

"I believe how holy God is every time I receive Him. During the consecration, I believe that the host is turned into the Body of Christ and that the wine is turned into the Blood of Christ. I still kneel during the Eucharistic prayer. I miss the bells that rang as soon as the priest lifted the host and cup — the bells were the sign to get ready because the priest did not face us. Now we are able to see the lifting of the Eucharist, and many stand rather than kneel to take in His True Presence.

"Before Covid, I visited many Eucharistic chapels in the area. Going in and talking to God, with the hope of listening to what he wanted of me, was very special. Each time I entered, the peace and quiet to talk to God was exciting. I don't visit the chapels as I used to — St. Scholastica has its own Eucharistic chapel, a chapel you can visit before and after a weekday Mass or before or after weekend Masses. In addition, the Eucharist is exposed the first Monday of the month from 1 to 5 p.m. If you have time, come join us and see how God talks to you.

"I am so grateful that I am able to attend Mass daily — not only to receive, but also to distribute, the Eucharist. To hold the Body of Christ in my hands and say "the Body of Christ" is such an honor.

"Thank you for letting me share this. Please take the time and write how you're feeling about the Holy Eucharist."

In closing: Today, the second Sunday of Easter, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. Many people pray the Divine Mercy devotion at 3 p.m. each day. This reflection brings back fond memories of a parishioner who carried the Divine Mercy Chaplet prayers in his shirt pocket. He would give one to anybody who seemed the least bit interested. His devotion to this prayer and his discipleship to engage others is something to emulate.

Here is the Concluding prayer to the Divine Mercy Chaplet (to be said three times):

"Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us, and on the whole world."


