# Your Weekly Message from Fr. Norbert, CR

I remember reading an article about the person that had leprosy in today's gospel. The article stated that he was indeed a lucky person. Yes, it also sounded odd to me. When would a disease be

considered lucky? The author's point was that he got to meet Jesus and experience Jesus' healing power. We all need to ask for Jesus' healing power in our lives. The Lord Jesus heals us because he loves us. That is a comforting thought because the Lord does not abandon us but remains with us in the holy Eucharist, the scriptures, and through each other. We too express the love of the Lord Jesus by our acts of kindness toward each other. This past Tuesday we entertained the priests from our deanery. These monthly deanery meetings alternate among the parishes in our deanery. We meet for mid-day prayer, share lunch together, and receive information about the Diocese of Joliet. It is also a time to get to know our neighboring parishes and gain a larger vision of the church in our diocese. Well, I am especially grateful for Marlene Clark, Marilyn Ristik, and Linda McGunn who helped us by arranging and preparing the food and the activity center for our meeting. Additionally, I am thankful for our parishioners who fulfill the regular ministries in our parish by proclaiming the scriptures at mass daily and weekends, helping to distribute the Holy Eucharist, by serving and assisting at

mass, and by being an usher at a given mass. Working together helps us bring about the Lord's presence in our midst. We cannot forget that this weekend we are invited to make our commitment to the support of the CMMA----the Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal. Through this appeal we, as a diocese, can help our neighbor in need as well as permit the diocese to provide the ministries to assist us all. Turning toward the future, we cannot forget that this coming Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten season. This gives us another opportunity to examine our lives and to correct whatever faults we may have. It is also a day of fast and abstinence. We are not to eat meat on Ash Wednesday and those over 18 years of age are to fast, i.e. reduce food intake. Recently my provincial superior informed me that the time has arrived for the diocese to change the personnel at St. Scholastica Parish. Both Fr. Ed and I will depart from St. Scholastica Parish on June 30, 2024. There will be a diocesan priest assigned as the new pastor. Both Fr. Ed and I are grateful and feel that we have been blessed by serving the Catholic Church here at St. Scholastica. We appreciate sharing ministry with Deacons Tom, Bob, and Rick. I have fond memories of Deacon Jerry Christensen, the late Roger Schmith, and the late Terry Zarembka. For a few months now several of our parishioners have pointed out to me that I am fairly well beyond the normal retirement age. I know this, but still find a joy in ministry. God bless you all and we will still have time sharing our faith and praying with each other over the remaining months.





# **Seniors Invited to Defer Property Taxes**

Qualified senior citizens, aged 65 years and older are invited to apply for the Senior Citizen Real Estate Tax Deferral Program. The program allows participants to defer property tax payment until the property is sold. The deferral is treated as a loan and accrues 3 percent simple interest until paid. To qualify, the applicant's household income cannot exceed \$65,000. Additionally, the property must be used exclusively for residential purposes. The application period closes March 1, 2024. 

Let's get back to the book that was given to us before Christmas—
"Beautiful Eucharist," published by Dynamic Catholic. Have you picked it up yet? Have you started reading? Have you finished reading?

Matthew Kelly invites us to reflect on Jesus, truly present in the Eucharist. We are reminded that at the Last Supper, Jesus took the bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me" (Luke 22:19).

We are called to take Jesus at his word.

From the earliest times, Christians have believed that the Eucharist was the body and blood of the risen Jesus, and not just a symbol. The Baltimore Catechism, enjoined by the Order of the Third Council of Baltimore and published in Boston in 1853, says: The Holy Eucharist is the Sacrament which contains the body and blood, soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ under the appearances of bread and wine" (Q. 870. What is the Holy Eucharist?).

More recently, our Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), promulgated by Pope John Paul II in 1992, says: "The essential signs of the Eucharistic sacrament are wheat bread and grape wine, on which the blessing of the Holy Spirit is invoked and the priest pronounces the words of consecration spoken by Jesus during the Last Supper: 'This is my body which will be given up for you ... This is the cup of my blood ... "(The Sacrament of the Eucharist, CCC 1412).

The CCC also says: "By the consecration the transubstantiation of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is brought about. Under the consecrated species of bread and wine Christ himself, living and glorious, is present in a true, real, and substantial manner: his Body and his Blood, with his soul and his divinity" (The Sacrament of the Eucharist, CCC 1413; cf. Council of Trent: DS 1640; 1651).

There are over 100 paragraphs in the CCC talking about and explaining the Eucharist!

I believe it takes an infinite number of paragraphs to describe this gift and mystery. Words from "Beautiful Eucharist," the catechisms, and other writings are helpful, and at the same time, it is helpful to remember that the Eucharist, Jesus, is the same Jesus who healed people by word and by touch. He is the same Jesus who brought people back to life and who himself rose from the dead. He is the same Jesus, the second person of the Holy Trinity, who walks with us each day and is with us in our joy and sorrows. He is with us always and, most especially, freely offered in the Eucharist.





# **Lenten Guidelines**

- 1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast and to abstain on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 3. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
- 4. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
- 5. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year; all, in addition to following the Lenten regulations, are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, serious prayer, and a performance of works of charity and mercy.
