Your Weekly Message from Fr. Norbert, CR

If you ever stop to think about it, numbers are among the items that remain with us throughout our lives. We may have had fun repeating numbers in kindergarten, and learning how to write them, but

those numbers became an important part of everything we do. Just think about the times we go shopping. Even with a debit card or a credit card the numbers are present to inform us as to how much we have spent. Along the roadways numbers are also important. We are supposed to watch our speed and remain within the limit printed on the signs. All through our years spent in school homework, the papers we had written, if there were not an A, B, C, etc. written upon them, there would be a number: if we were lucky and did our work correctly it would be a high number. As we entered the time of Lent numbers also became evident to us. This past Wednesday, Ash Wednesday, we began a journey. This

journey is forty days long. The time of Lent reflects the number of years that the Lord's chosen people would wander in the desert searching for the place that the Lord had designated for them, or the number of days that Jesus would fast as he prayed in the desert. We too have entered upon a forty-day journey. A journey through the Lenten season, but it is more than just passing time. It is an opportunity for us to take stock of our lives and see if we are still moving to be closer to the Lord. Throughout the journey we may discover some rough spots in our lives that need to be corrected. Lent is the time to do this. It also is a time of praying and thanking the Lord. There will be opportunities of gathering together to recall how Our Lord Jesus gave himself for our redemption. This year is a good time to join our fellow parishioners in recalling the saving events that call us together as a people of the Lord. I pray that this Lent is a holy and uplifting experience for all of us. God bless you and may this season bring you closer to the Lord.





Seniors Invited to Defer Property Taxes

Qualified senior citizens, aged 65 years and older are invited to apply for the Senior Citizen Real Estate Tax Deferral Program. The program allows participants to defer property tax payment until the property is sold. The deferral is treated as a loan and accrues 3 percent simple interest until paid. To qualify, the applicant's household income cannot exceed \$65,000. Additionally, the property must be used exclusively for residential purposes. The application period closes March 1, 2024. 
