

Your Weekly Message from Fr. Norbert, CR

This week I almost felt as if I were sharing thoughts with Job. My problem was trying to get my brain started to write this article. I had a large number of little things floating around as possible topics but was unable to center upon a single topic. Well, I finally settled

down and my topic is Job. Honestly Job is not the most cheerful and up lifting biblical story in the Old Testament because he just focuses upon the misery he is living through. Whatever was positive in his life has been pushed out of his memory: he just recalls all his suffering and sad events which he had to live through. To be honest there are times in our lives too when we feel that we are overburdened and find it difficult to move forward. We concentrate only on the sad and trying moments and fail to see the enjoyable experiences we have had in our lives. When we suffer as Job suffered, nothing else matters. Every moment of every day is consumed with wondering, "Why me? Why did this happen to me?" If we are fortunate, we may have someone close to us who will simply listen and help us to figure out things. One of the ways that may help us

is to recall the joy filled moments of our lives and seek other positive moments in life. Prayer too is on the positive side. Not just asking for help to go beyond the difficult moment, but to also offer thanksgiving for the blessings that God has continually bestowed upon us. Prayer is always helpful. This Sunday we are asked to remember to give thanks for all the women and men who have given themselves to Our Lord Jesus Christ by publicly professing the vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience in religious life. This includes monks, hermits, men and women dedicated to contemplative life, active religious life as sisters, brothers, and priests. Those who choose this life are committed to imitating Christ, engaging in his ministries of spreading the Good News, and showing that "the world can be transfigured with the spirit of the beatitudes" (Catechism 932). Also at a finance council meeting a discussion was held about creating a directory of trades of our parishioners that can be accessed by the parish office when we are in need of advice. This is not to seek free work, but educated advice as to what is the best choice in doing a project. And finally, the Diocese of Joliet has launched the 2024 Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal. This year's theme is For the Glory of God. Please support our diocese in fulfilling its ministries. God bless you and have a great week.





"The Eucharist is the greatest gift given to us. It's startling to think that the Lord — in spite of His suffering, rejection, and sorrow — gave His life in order to grant us the way to heaven. We can speak to the Lord in prayer, but the reception of the Eucharist is the moment when we can experience real intimacy with Jesus; what greater way to talk with our greatest friend. The Lord told us that when we receive Him in this sacrament, He lives in us and we live in Him."

"If in doubt, priests have experienced many miracles during consecration, miracles that prove that the sacrament is real. The first was in 8th-century Italy, when the bread and wine were transformed into real human flesh and blood. Some recent miracles cannot be explained by scientists, proof that they are greater than science."

"The Vatican International Exhibition, 'The Eucharistic Miracles of the World,' catalogs more than 100 miracles that have been venerated since the earliest days of the Church. That leaves no doubt. In addition, Chapter 3 of Bishop Robert Barron's book 'This Is My Body' helps our belief, giving us insight, through the learned, of the mystery of the Eucharist."


