

Your Weekly Message from Fr. Norbert, CR

Slowly we are settling into the new year of 2024. At times we may feel as if the festivities of Christmas and the beginning of a New Year are still being celebrated, but they are long gone. Routine might be a good

word to describe this time of the year as we try to get back into a work or study mode. It is not always easy to follow the routines we have established for ourselves once we have taken a break. Naturally, we will still recall the memories we shared and enjoyed with our family members and friends over the Christmas and New Years' time. Hopefully, we will still stay in contact with family members and friends and share the funny incidents that took place during our time together. We may even share some of these events with other friends or family members. 

My family's prayers are with me, no matter where I roam. Please listen when I'm lonely and return me safely home.





Come Learn about the Life of St. Isaac Jogues

Director of Catechesis and Evangelization, Michael Lewandowski, will present on the life of St. Isaac Jogues. Born to a prosperous family in France in 1609, his desire was to bring the Gospel far and wide as a Jesuit missionary. He first ministered among the Hurons in Canada. Fr. Jogues struggled to spread the Gospel in the New World. He bore much suffering and danger, and witnessed terrible torture. However, his zeal and love for souls would eventually bear fruit.

Fr. Jogues returned to France after being captured and tortured by the Mohawks. He eventually left France once more to again minister in the New World, where he was martyred. He was canonized in 1930, along with the seven other North American Martyrs.

A devoted parishioner shares:

"I personally did not attend Catholic school but went to CCD through 8th grade. It wasn't until my daughter was in college and was involved in the Newman Catholic Student Center when I realized that Jesus is present in the Eucharist. She told me in a conversation that she was going to Adoration. She explained to me that it is a sign of devotion and worship of Jesus Christ present in the Eucharist. She explained how praying in the presence of Christ is so powerful. This brought me to the understanding that when we receive Communion after the priest consecrates the bread and wine that it becomes the actual body and blood of Christ.

"As Jesus said, 'Unless you eat the flesh of the son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you.' I understand now that eating the body of Christ helps us become united to the person of Christ through his humanity."

The Diocese of Joliet will return to Navajo Nation for a two-week mission focused on construction and outreach from June 1 to 14, 2024.

The Diocese of Joliet has been putting faith into action—through intentional service and solidarity with the poor—in Chinle, Arizona, for 20 years.

The Office of Mission is seeking parishioners (18+) willing to help local area families with light construction work. No experience is necessary, but a heart willing to serve is required! Missionaries stay on the campus of Our Lady of Fatima, and the trip will include a pilgrimage to New Mexico's Loretto Chapel and it's "miraculous staircase."


