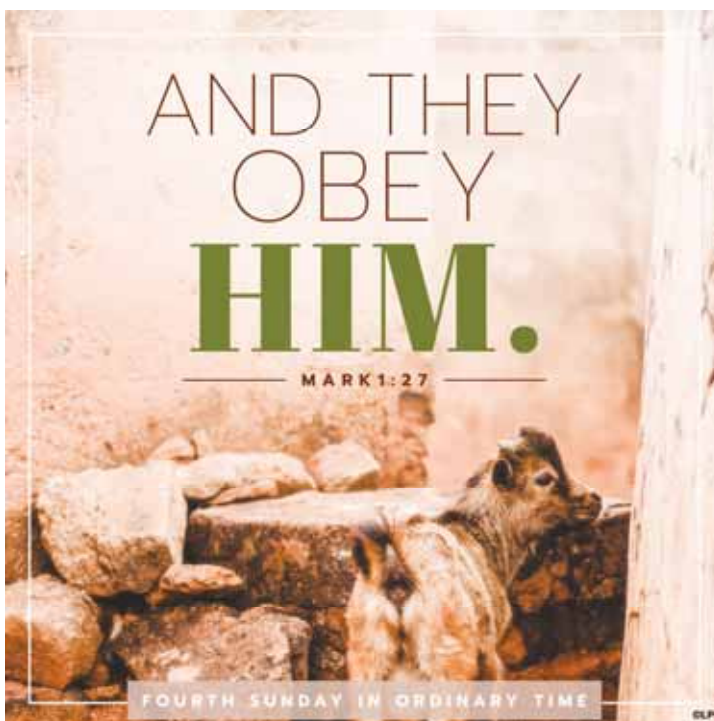

Sacrament of Baptism

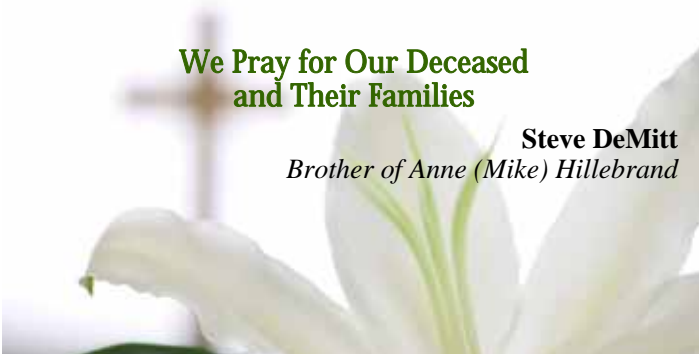

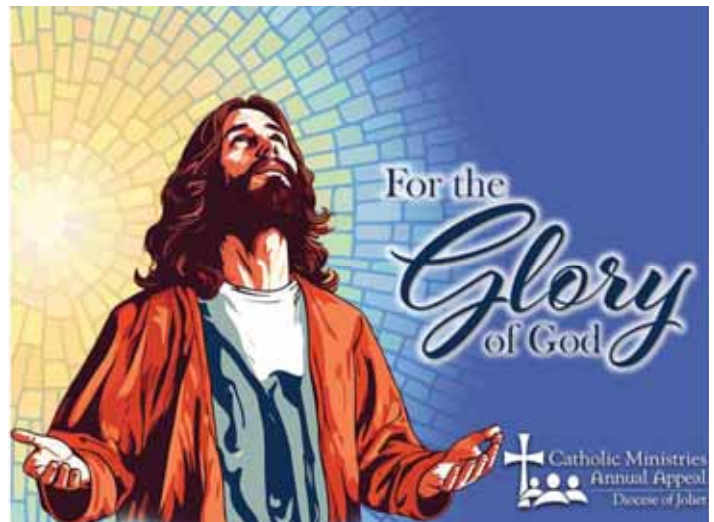

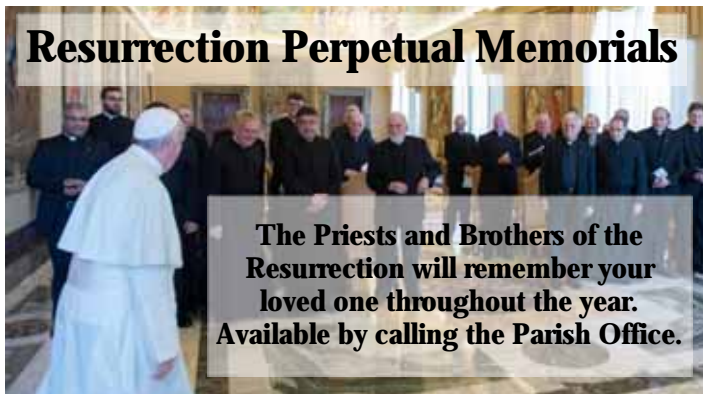
