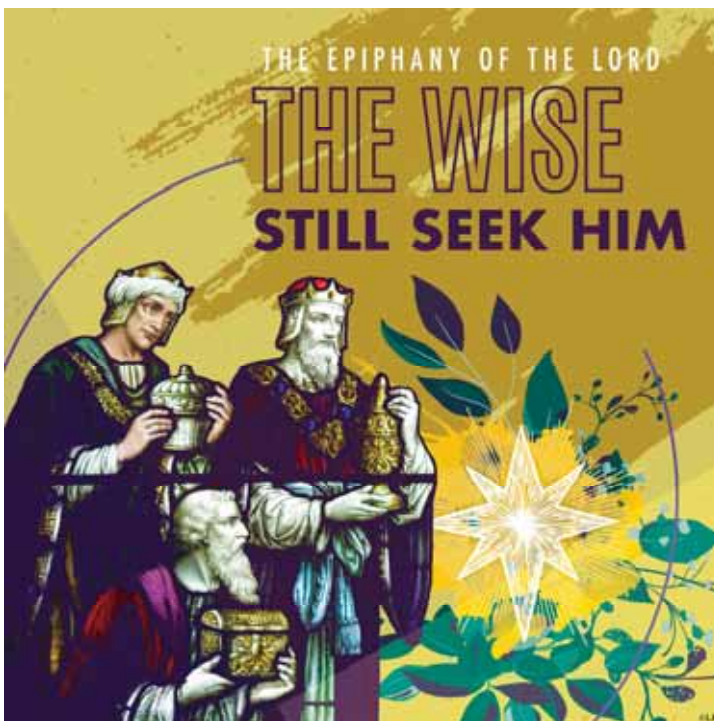

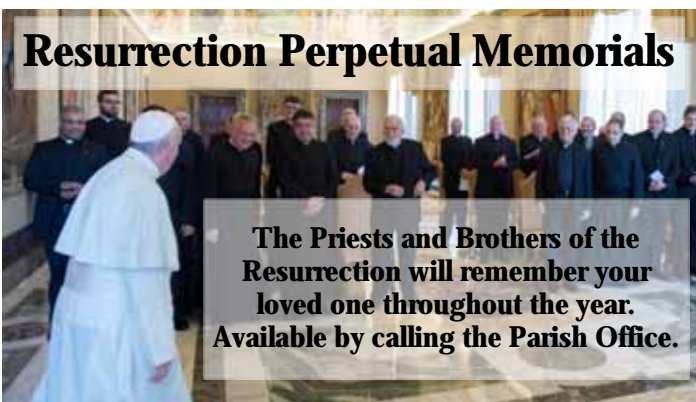


Your Weekly Message from Fr. Norbert, CR

Greetings in this new year! Now comes the challenge to remember to put the number “24” on all documents which require a date. I am positive that I will make a mistake for some time during this new year and write “2023” instead of “2024”. It seems as if the Christmas season went speeding by rapidly. But we still need to take time to stop and think about what we celebrate as a Church. The images and various scripture passages that we encounter currently, immediately after Christmas Day, still touch upon the light that the Lord Jesus brings into our world. On this first Sunday of 2024 we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. Basically “epiphany” means that some type of a revelation has taken place. It is an unexpected moment or experience in which we finally understand something in a completely new way. We just spent time thinking about God’s tremendous love for us when the Second Person of the Holy Trinity took on flesh and blood and was born in time. What we celebrate today is that deepest mystery – God’s revelation to the world in Jesus Christ, born as a humble, vulnerable child in an out of the way place. God is with us – always with us, in our

ordinary lives, through the miracle of the incarnation. Liturgically this concludes the Christmas Season for us, but the Church points us toward those kings from the east to remind us that Jesus came not only to be a light to the Jewish people, but a light to the whole world. There are interesting traditions and celebrations surrounding the Feast of the Epiphany. In Italy there is one more character: La Befana. According to legend and a poem written by Agnolo Firenzuola in 1549 says that on the 12th day of Christmas La Befana, dressed in dark rags flies over houses on her broom to place candy, nuts, figs, and other gifts in the socks of children; however, those who did not behave properly during the year will receive a lump of coal. Traditionally families would leave some wine and cake for her as she made her rounds. Many of us recall that the Three Kings, or Wise Men, come from the East bringing gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh to give to the newborn king of the Jews. Once again, I would like to offer a large THANK YOU to all of our parishioners who offered their service as lectors, ushers, musicians, choir members, mass servers, liturgical coordinators, and eucharist ministers. A parish is a family of members assisting each other to be closer to the Lord. Finally, Fr. Ed, Deacons Tom, Bob, and Rick and I ask God to bless you all for your kindness to us and to the parish.

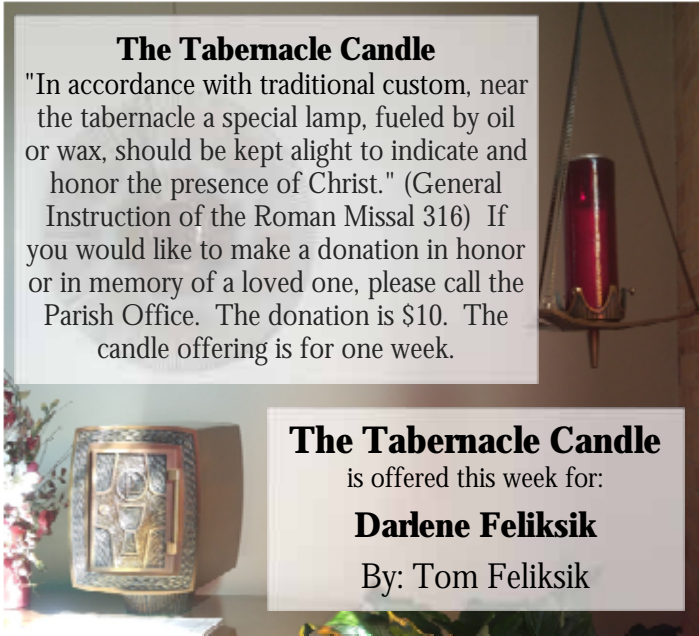

The Diocese of Joliet has been putting faith into action—through intentional service and solidarity with the poor—in Chinle, Arizona, for 20 years.

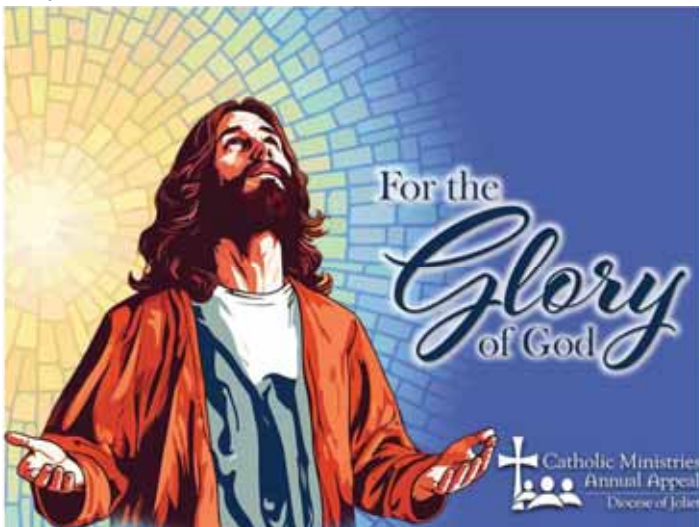
