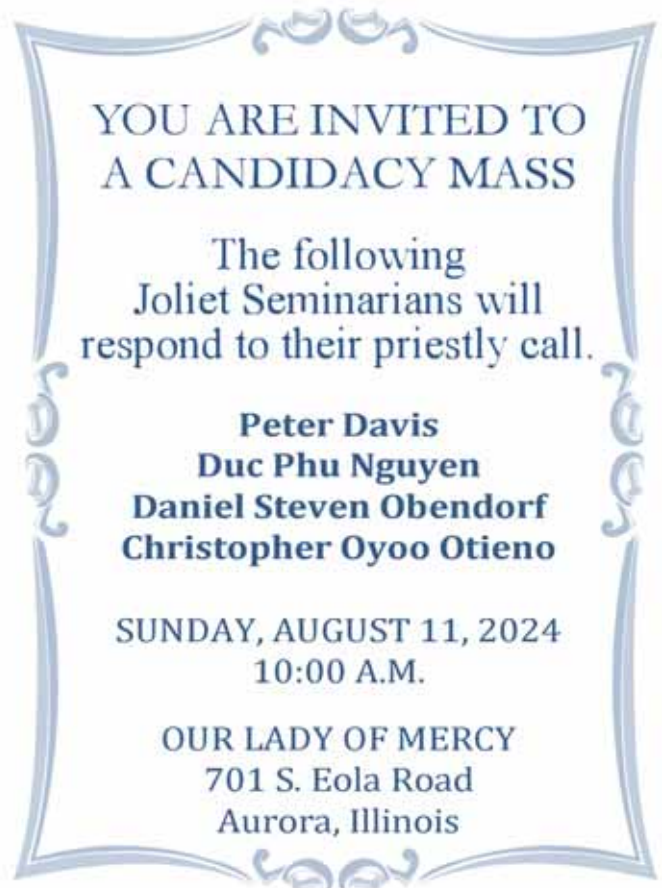




Prayer for the Return of Non-practicing Catholics

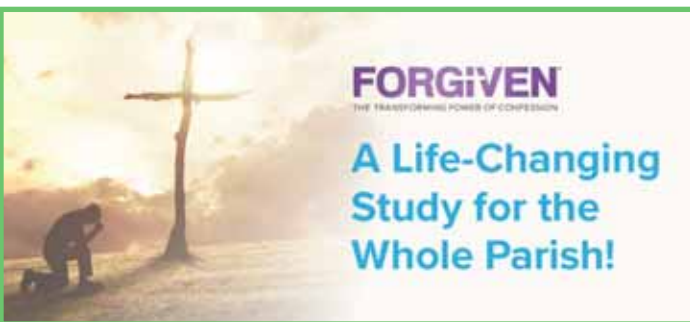

We as Catholics know the significance of the Last Supper and Jesus' establishment of the Eucharist. Or at least we are supposed to. Yet there are many Catholics who don't believe in the real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

As a child we were told what we should and must believe without any question. I was always asking why. And how. As an adult and as an engineer, I had to have things explained logically and with proof. I never had any doubt about what I was told or learned as a child. I just wanted logical explanations for those beliefs. When Vatican II opened up Bible studies to the lay person without having to have a priest explain the Bible's meaning, I joined a Bible study group. But my engineering mind wanted to read the Bible like a technical manual and look for the logic and reason in every word. I became frustrated when I could not find it. I did, however, stick with it even with my frustration. It all came together at the Resurrection narrative. There, Jesus' disciples saw the risen Christ. For them, when they saw the risen Jesus, any doubts they may have had were gone. For me the Resurrection narrative put everything in perspective and my frustration was gone.

To question is okay. Often questioning deepens our faith. I had never doubted the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. I had to, and did, become comfortable with reading the Bible and allowing Scripture to speak to me, listening to what God was telling me through those sacred words.

I can understand that some would question the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, especially if a person thinks in human terms and not in spiritual terms, not realizing that anything is possible with God.

Our Lord said, "I am the Bread of Life. He who feeds on my Flesh and drinks my Blood has life eternal and I will raise him up on the last day. For my Flesh is real food and my Blood real drink. The man who feeds on my Flesh and drinks my Blood remains in Me, and I in him" (Jn 6:35, 54-56). We must, therefore, never forget that when we participate at Mass, we witness a miracle, and through the reception of Holy Communion we share in the divine life of our Savior.
