

# How Can I Get to the Parish During Road Construction?

Construction on Janes Avenue began Wednesday, April 24 and will continue through the end of the summer. During Phase I, only northbound traffic will be allowed on Janes Avenue from 83rd Street to the driveway closest to Dunkin Donuts south of 75th Street. Southbound traffic will be diverted to Woodward Avenue, where you will be allowed to come north on Janes Avenue (traffic may be slow due to construction) to the front entrance to the parish parking lot. Another way to access our parking lot from the north is to take Woodridge Drive south (this is the stop light between Janes Avenue and 53rd) to Jonquil, where you will turn left. Jonquil ends at Chestnut, where you will follow the road, curving right. You can then access the parking lot to the left.

# Your Weekly Message from Fr. Norbert, CR

Greetings at the beginning of this month of June. Many things have happened and will happen during this month. One of the most popular items is that school is recessed for the summer. Elementary school

students and many high school students will enjoy this free time, but it is not always a total time off from responsibility because a fair number of high school students have jobs. Granted there are also some university students who will use these summer months to study and continue moving forward toward their degree. But on another topic this Sunday we recall an important part of our faith: the Holy Eucharist. We remember what the Lord Jesus did during the meal that we refer to as Holy Thursday. He used simple elements of bread and wine and transformed them into His Body and Blood. The Eucharist has been a strong part of our faith because it is the Lord sharing Himself with us. The Feast that we celebrate today was strongly promoted by a Norbertine canoness, Juliana of Liège, also known as Juliana de Cornillon. She propagated a devotion to the Eucharist. She was born around the year 1191 near Liège, Belgium. Sadly, she and her sister were orphaned at an early age and cared for by Augustinian nuns at the convent of Mont-Cornillon. Obviously, the influence of the Augustinian nuns made a strong impact upon her and her sister. At age 16 she joined the Augustinian nuns and, in her prayer life, experienced a strong devotion to the Eucharist. As the years moved forward, she approached various bishops to have a feast honoring the Eucharist placed upon local church calendars. In the year 1246 the bishop of Liège directed that a celebration of Corpus Christi is to be observed in the diocese each year on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. Over the centuries many Eucharistic miracles have taken place. One of the more famous has been at Lanciano, Italy. It took place around the year 700 and the Eucharist is kept in a glass monstrance and glass chalice. It is still fresh and after many tests over the centuries no preservatives are found in these elements. But the real miracle is how we permit the Lord Jesus' Body and Blood to help us grow in our faith. I want to thank the Knights of Columbus for their gift of \$ 500.00 to the parish. May this be a wonderful week for you. God bless you and stay well.








# Father's Day "Spiritual Bouquets"

# The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ: Blessed, Broken, and Shared

THE GRACE I SEEK: to have a spirit of loving obedience to all that God asks, especially to help build a Eucharistic culture

#### IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN.

Pause for a few moments, and allow yourself to become aware of Jesus' gift of himself in the Eucharist. Realize that, at this very moment, the Lord of Life is gazing upon you with great love. Allow yourself to receive his loving gaze. You are his beloved child. Rest in his loving gaze.

Thank Jesus for the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

ASK FOR THE GRACE: Jesus, help me to have a spirit of loving obedience to all that God asks, especially to help build a Eucharistic culture.

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you through this passage.

#### "Taking the book of the covenant, he read it aloud to the people, who answered, 'All that the Lord has said, we will heed and do.' Then he took the blood and sprinkled it on the people, saying, 'This is the blood of the covenant that the Lord has made with you.'" (Exodus 24:7–8)

**REFLECTION QUESTION** — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

Every time God made a covenant with his people, it was "sealed in blood." He chose to send his Beloved Son, who shed his Blood to set us free, sealing the "new and everlasting covenant." How can I grow in gratitude for the Blood of Christ outpoured for my salvation? How can I stand in true awe as I consider how the Body of Christ was literally tortured, realizing that he did this out of love for me?

SCRIPTURE MEDITATION — Read slowly, 3–4 times. Again, allow the words of Scripture to wash over your mind and heart. Let the Holy Spirit speak to you through this passage.

#### "While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, 'Take it; this is my body.' Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, 'This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many.'" (Mark 14:22–24)

**REFLECTION QUESTION** — Allow yourself to sit with these questions for a while, being attentive to how the Lord is speaking in your heart.

What a profound moment in salvation history! Jesus celebrates the first Mass with his disciples, instituting the Eucharist. With deep gratitude and wonder in our hearts, let us pray, "Lord, I give you thanks and praise for the gift of the Eucharist—the renewal of the Paschal Mystery in which I participate at every Mass. I ask you for the grace to receive your Body and Blood in Holy Communion with awe, allowing you to transform my life so it can be a living reflection of your Eucharistic Heart: blessed, broken, and shared so that all may have life."

Remain in silence with the Lord. Allow him to speak in the silence, in your heart. Receive his presence. If it helps, write down what you sense the Lord communicating to you during this time of prayer.

**CLOSING PRAYER** — O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament have left us a memorial of your Passion, grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries of your Body and Blood that we may always experience in ourselves the fruits of your redemption. Who live and reign with God the Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen. (Collect, Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ)

**SUNDAY MASS CONNECTION** — At every Mass, Jesus offers himself to the Father for us. We can always join our own offerings with Jesus at Mass. This Sunday, offer your desire to enter more fully into Holy Mass so that you can become a living sacrifice of praise with Jesus.

LOVE IN ACTION — During the coming week, make your love for our Eucharistic Lord concrete by spending extra time with him in Eucharistic adoration, offering that time of prayer for those in most need of his mercy.

The Catholic faith recognizes that the greatest gift God gives us is himself, and Adoration is another way for us to recognize that gift outside of receiving the Eucharist at Mass. So, don't overthink it. Just receive the gift.
