



Dear Woodridge Neighbors,

I would like to provide you with a community update regarding our tornado disaster recovery.

It was Father's Day evening on June 20, 2021, when an EF-3 tornado hit Woodridge hard and caused disastrous impacts across our community. To this day, 35 months later, we still have neighbors out of their Woodridge County Club #5 condos. Our neighbors have endured much. Some neighbors had nowhere to live and still needed to pay their mortgage and assessments for a home they could not live in. They also have to pay rent for their temporary housing and are also responsible for paying an almost \$1MM Insurance Coverage Gap as part of their homeowner's association future assessments. It has been a long, exhausting, and stress-filled road. So, with much neighborly care at heart, I am asking every helping hand to please help us bring our neighbors home! We are grateful for our neighbors' resilience, kindness, and perseverance in staying strong for almost 3 years. Their unwavering strength and perseverance have been a beacon of hope for all of us. In these challenging times, their acts of great compassion have touched many hearts. Today, I find myself ever-inspired by our community spirit and I am reaching out to ask you for your help in bringing our neighbors home. As a community, we stand together through thick and thin. Now, more than ever, is the time to be united, extend our helping hands, and show our neighbors that we are a community bound by kindness, empathy, and great care.

Woodridge Neighbors Helping Neighbors Disaster Recovery is a registered 501[©] (3) organization that was created in August 2021 in direct response to the June 20th tornado. For the past three years, WNHNDR and its Board, volunteers, partners, and friends have been dedicated to serving our Woodridge community and neighbors with great compassion and service through the long-term disaster recovery process.

Mayors Helping Mayors (MHM) was started to help make a difference to our Woodridge community and neighbors! MHM is helping WNHNDR to bring our neighbors home. Mayors Frank Trilla (Willowbrook) and Joseph Marchese (Darien) reached out to help us make a difference to our neighbors in need. Together with other neighboring Mayors, we have created a tornado disaster Friendraiser to be held on June 26, 2024, to benefit our neighbors at WCC5. I have included the Friendraiser invitation, printed on the left, for your consideration and ask that you please join us in "Doin' Good!"

I asked people whether they believe that Jesus is present in the Eucharist. They said yes, and seemed to have vivid memories of when they came to believe.

They had experienced aha moments.

I thought, Why can't this happen to me? Why can't I too have an aha moment? If I believe that Jesus healed through word and touch, that he raised Lazarus from the dead, that he himself rose from the dead, then surely I must believe that Jesus is present in the Eucharist. Right?

I wasn't sure, but stumbled across a way to address my uncertainty. While reading "Beautiful Eucharist"—a book by Matthew Kelly distributed after Mass one Sunday—I found this quotation from Bishop Andrew Cozzins: "Bring whatever uncertainty you are currently facing to Jesus in the Eucharist and ask: '*Jesus, what do you think I should do?*""

I found my answer in *Lectio Divina* (divine reading), a practice I learned in my Catholic Bible study group. *Lectio Divina* means reading Scripture and asking what parts of it speak to you.

These verses, for example, spoke to me:

- t "Everything is possible to one who has faith" (Mark 9:23).
- "I do believe, help my unbelief!" (Mark 9:24).
- [†] "Therefore I tell you, all that you ask for in prayer, believe that you will receive it and it shall be yours" (Mark 11:24).

What spoke to me even more was Fr. Mike Schmitz's commentary on John 6: 48-71 (The Bible in a Year podcast, Day 100: This is My Body). Fr. Mike explains that this is the only place in the Gospel where followers leave Jesus over a teaching. The teaching in question is that we must *literally* eat his flesh and drink his blood, a teaching that many found impossible to accept. Once followers began to leave, Jesus turns to his Apostles and asks them whether they're planning to leave as well.

To quote Fr. Mike: "Peter looks at Jesus and he says, master, Lord, to whom shall we go?"

I'm not sure I'll ever have the aha moment I've been looking for. But I will continue to ask Jesus for that belief. After all, to whom shall I go?

Opportunities for Indulgences

"It is with gratitude to the Holy Father that we receive his Apostolic Blessing upon the participants in the National Eucharistic Congress, and for the opportunity for Catholics in our country to obtain a plenary indulgence by participating in the events of the Eucharistic Revival," said Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops. Fostering encounter, sparking personal conversion, and forming disciples will be opportunities for a personal revival in the faith and the fruits of the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and National Eucharistic Congress to be held this summer.

The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and National Eucharistic Congress are milestone moments in the U.S. bishops' threeyear Eucharistic Revival initiative. Archbishop Broglio requested the Apostolic Penitentiary (the office within the Roman Curia that is charged with the granting and use of indulgences as expressions of divine mercy) that a <u>plenary</u> <u>indulgence</u> be granted to Catholics who participate in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage. It was also requested that he or another prelate be designated to impart the Apostolic Blessing with a Plenary Indulgence to the Christian faithful present at the National Eucharistic Congress.

"Through the efforts of the revival over the last two years, we have been building up to the pilgrimage and congress that will offer Catholics a chance to experience a profound, personal revival of faith in the Eucharist. Pope Francis continues to encourage and support us as we seek to share Christ's love with a world that is desperately in need of Him," said Archbishop Broglio, upon receiving the news that Pope Francis had recently granted the requests.


Plenary Indulgence for National Eucharistic Pilgrimage

A decree issued by the Apostolic Penitentiary and approved by Pope Francis indicates that the plenary indulgence will be granted to the Christian faithful who participate in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage at any point between May 17 and July 16, 2024. It will also be granted to the elderly, infirm, and all those who cannot leave their homes for a serious reason and who participate in spirit with the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage, uniting their prayers, pains, or inconveniences with Christ and the pilgrimage. This indulgence is granted under the usual conditions of sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father. The faithful may also apply this indulgence through suffrage for the souls of the faithful departed in Purgatory. In recognition of this extraordinary event, the Apostolic Penitentiary also requests that all priests who have been endowed with the appropriate faculties for hearing Confessions present themselves willingly and generously in administering the Sacrament of Penance to all who participate in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage.

Papal Blessing with Plenary Indulgence for National Eucharistic Congress

The second decree issued by the Apostolic Penitentiary and approved by Pope Francis, says that Archbishop Broglio or another prelate of episcopal rank assigned by him, following the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, may impart the Papal Blessing with a Plenary Indulgence to the Christian Faithful who participate in the National Eucharistic Congress, who are truly repentant, and who are motivated by charity, if the usual conditions for indulgences—sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father—have been met. Faithful individuals who, due to reasonable circumstances and with pious intention, have participated in the sacred rites and received the Papal Blessing through media communications, may also obtain a Plenary Indulgence.

The National Eucharistic Revival began on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) in 2022 and continues through 2025. Following the congress will be a "Year of Missionary Sending," in which Catholics from all stages and walks of life will be sent out to share Christ's love that they have received in encounter with him through the Eucharist. 
The First-Ever National Eucharistic Pilgrimage

How Can I Get to the Parish During Road Construction?

Construction on Janes Avenue began Wednesday, April 24 and will continue through the end of the summer. During Phase I, only northbound traffic will be allowed on Janes Avenue from 83rd Street to the driveway closest to Dunkin Donuts south of 75th Street. Southbound traffic will be diverted to Woodward Avenue, where you will be allowed to come north on Janes Avenue (traffic may be slow due to construction) to the front entrance to the parish parking lot. Another way to access our parking lot from the north is to take Woodridge Drive south (this is the stop light between Janes Avenue and 53rd) to Jonquil, where you will turn left. Jonquil ends at Chestnut, where you will follow the road, curving right. You can then access the parking lot to the left.
