

Your Weekly Message from Fr. Norbert, CR

In the gospel passage this Easter Sunday according to St. John we hear that, *"On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark..."* She was

surprised when she discovered that the stone covering the entrance of the tomb had been moved away. Not knowing what to think she ran to tell Peter and the other disciple about what she found. It was the other disciple, who ran with Peter, who immediately believed that the Lord had risen from the dead when he entered the empty tomb. This past Lent was our entering the empty tomb and realizing that the Lord Jesus is truly risen and lives among us. When we share in this Eucharist at Mass, we proclaim the good news that the Risen Lord remains with us. Easter Sunday is a celebration of a life-giving event and all of us are invited to be His witnesses to everyone we encounter. On behalf of the entire staff at St. Scholastica Parish and School, I wish you all a joy filled Easter. Alleluia! Since this is my final Easter message to the parish, I wish to reiterate that both Fr. Ed and I are members of the religious community, the Congregation of the Resurrection. It was early on Easter Sunday morning, March 27, 1842, that the first seven men made their way to the catacomb of St. Sebastian on Via Appia Anticha, which is just outside the walls of Rome. They formed a new religious community, the Congregation of the Resurrection and professed the vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience after mass. Over these 182 years of existence the CR's have proclaimed the Risen Lord in various parts of the world where we have ministered, and hopefully Fr. Ed and I have brought the presence of the Risen Christ to St. Scholastica Parish. Once again, we pray that you have a truly blessed and Happy Easter. Alleluia!


