Your Weekly Message from Fr. Norbert, CR

The Solemnity of Pentecost concludes the Easter season which began with the celebration of Our Lord's Resurrection. Last Sunday we celebrated the Ascension of our Lord into heaven, but, as you

know, the Lord did not abandon us because today we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, the descent of the Holy Spirit upon us. Looking back in time what a surprise that must have been for the few Apostles who were gathered and hiding in fear. Suddenly they receive a greeting of peace from the Risen Lord Himself. But that is not the end of the story because besides receiving the greeting of peace from the Risen Lord Jesus, they were also given a mission to go out of their hiding place and share their experience of the Risen Lord Jesus with others: As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit". He then sends them out and tells them to receive the Holy Spirit. The Apostles go out and begin to boldly proclaim to those gathered in Jerusalem about the Lord Jesus not only being risen from the dead, but that He is the Lord and Savior of us all. We acknowledge this as the beginning of the Church.

Indeed, an extremely exciting moment then, but many centuries later we have the same instruction to go out and proclaim the risen Lord to our world too. Many may say that they do not know how to proclaim that the Lord is risen from the dead, but in reality, we do. The way we conduct our lives and how we treat others is a way of proclaiming that the risen Lord is still present among us. Today the whole Church celebrates the Solemnity of Pentecost: we celebrate it as the fiftieth day since the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus and the descent of the Holy Spirit. The Lord Jesus gave us the Holy Spirit to lead us and guide us throughout our lives. I pray that we always keep our hearts and minds open to the Holy Spirit. Definitely the Lord has not abandoned us, but still shares his life and presence with us in the Holy Eucharist. So too the Solemnity of Pentecost was not a one-time event, but the Holy Spirit continues to guide us and give us the strength to go announce the good news of salvation. I do want to express my gratitude to the Knights of Columbus of the Robert P. Connelly Council 5918 for nominating and presenting me with the Victor Cardosi award last Sunday. Indeed, it was an honor to accept this award. The Knights of Columbus are highly active in keeping the message and mission of Our Lord in our day and age. May you have a great week and remain open to the promptings of the Holy Spirit.



I learned early in life that the Communion wafer was Jesus' real body. But it was only as an adult that I begin to appreciate it as a source of spiritual nourishment — bread for my journey through life.

I was in my early thirties when I discovered Frederick Buechner, the late Presbyterian minister, theologian, and storyteller. In his historical novel "Godric," Buechner reconstructs the life of St. Godric of Finchale, a 12th-century holy man. There's a scene in which Godric is being coaxed by the Spirit into becoming a hermit. The Spirit assures him that just as in leaving home for the first time you leave a piece of your heart behind, in commencing a journey you leave a piece of your heart ahead, and until you find that place, "every other place you find will fret you like a cage."

The idea of anxiously following your heart sounded familiar to me, and I recalled a line from St. Augustine's "Confessions": "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you." I was on a journey — with a spiritual destination. I needed sustenance, and I needed to follow my heart.

Such a journey could also be described as a pilgrimage. A pilgrimage is any journey with a spiritual, or holy, destination. The destination could be as far away as Lourdes or Rome or the Holy Land — or as close as the altar at Sunday Mass, where "Jesus meets us and presents himself to us as food for our journey forward" (National Eucharistic Revival Spark Series, Day 7).

May the following prayer — found on the National Eucharistic Revival Spark Series, Day 7 —guide us on our journeys:

Jesus, we know this world is not our home. Thank you for being our faithful companion on this pilgrimage. We pray that you grant us the grace to continue this journey forward, that each day we may take a step closer to you and your perfect will for our lives. Be our strength as we experience the ups and downs of life. Remain with us as we continue our way home to you. Amen.

How Can I Get to the Parish During Road Construction?

Construction on Janes Avenue began Wednesday, April 24 and will continue through the end of the summer. During Phase I, only northbound traffic will be allowed on Janes Avenue from 83rd Street to the driveway closest to Dunkin Donuts south of 75th Street. Southbound traffic will be diverted to Woodward Avenue, where you will be allowed to come north on Janes Avenue (traffic may be slow due to construction) to the front entrance to the parish parking lot. Another way to access our parking lot from the north is to take Woodridge Drive south (this is the stop light between Janes Avenue and 53rd) to Jonquil, where you will turn left. Jonquil ends at Chestnut, where you will follow the road, curving right. You can then access the parking lot to the left.

There continues to be a new generation of children who need to learn about God, and how to live a good and holy life. This generation needs good teachers and catechists.




