In Matthew’s gospel, the last words of Jesus to the disciples before ascending have three key elements: go, baptize, I’m with you. Therefore, living after the resurrection of Jesus means three things. (1) Do not stay where it is safe; shed your doubt; go everywhere to everyone. (2) Baptizing into and teaching about resurrected life go together. That is why the baptismal catechumenate (OCIA) always spends so much time and effort in formation before an Easter Vigil. Time with parents and their babies, too. (3) We are not alone. Matthew ends with Jesus declaring, “I am with you always” just as this gospel began with the Virgin’s birth of Emmanuel (God is with us.).

- † What doubt do I have about God, about belief, about Church, about living in this world? Where can I turn?
- † What ongoing formation in baptismal living do I need now?
- † To whom am I called to “go” - someone to be with, to do for?

Your Weekly Message from Fr. Norbert, CR

This past week was filled with many activities just as almost any week in our parochial life here at St. Scholastica Parish. Quite often we think that everything moves along smoothly, but a reality check will usually reveal that there are

several bumps along the way. This past week we celebrated the graduation of our eighth-grade class. A very exciting moment for the students and their families, but soon they will discover that the path they must follow into the future is a lot longer than they realized. No matter what you know there is always something more to learn. However, we do wish them success in their next step in the educational process and their future and their continued growth as Catholics. This Sunday we celebrate the *Solemnity of the Holy Trinity*. Sounds simple, but after many centuries we still barely comprehend what the Holy Trinity is. It is definitely a mystery of faith. Although the Trinity is a mystery, many believers do enjoy a familiarity with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and have made them a part of their daily prayer lives. When believers enter a church they normally reach for holy water in the font, or in the baptismal font and they bless themselves while signing themselves on their forehead, their shoulders while saying, "In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," they do it effortlessly and automatically.

Additionally, when they kneel to pray, they once again begin by making the Sign of the Cross. Believers easily address the mysterious Trinity, the triune God. There is no hesitation or fear. But as many of you are aware of, the mystery of the Holy Trinity has been at the center of many controversies among politicians, emperors, and theologians, and even crowds of people fought on the streets in the fourth century because of their personal understanding, or lack of understanding about the Holy Trinity. Often at the heart of these battles was the question of One God and three distinct Persons. Fortunately, a preacher by the name of Athanasius and a bishop by the name of Ambrose used philosophy, scripture, and tradition to come to some responses about the Trinity: Athanasius guided the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD to come to a creedal statement about the Trinity. It is not easy, but we still practice our faith with the mystery of the Trinity. Great minds like Tertullian, St. Gregory of Nyssa, St. Thomas Aquinas are just few of our ancestors in faith who tried to explain a Triune God and we still are trying to wrap our minds around this loving God. Although the Trinity is a mystery, as believers we enjoy a familiarity with it and have made the Trinity part of our daily prayer lives. Other than the Holy Trinity, we too are mysteries. It is only after we continue to grow that we learn about ourselves, our personal talents, and capabilities, etc. May this week be one of growing closer to the Holy Trinity. Have a great and healthy week.

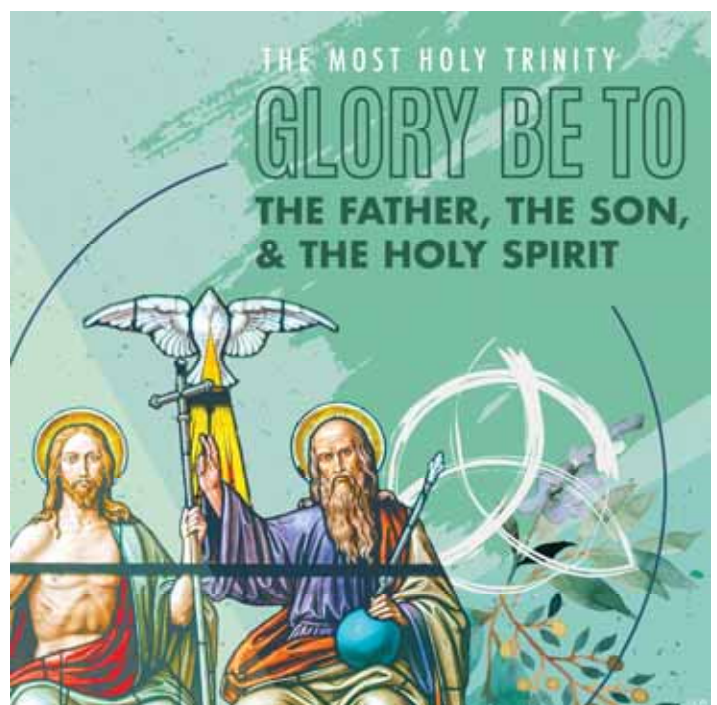


Raffle Ticket Sales for support of the Congregation of the Resurrection

How Can I Get to the Parish During Road Construction?

Construction on Janes Avenue began Wednesday, April 24 and will continue through the end of the summer. During Phase I, only northbound traffic will be allowed on Janes Avenue from 83rd Street to the driveway closest to Dunkin Donuts south of 75th Street. Southbound traffic will be diverted to Woodward Avenue, where you will be allowed to come north on Janes Avenue (traffic may be slow due to construction) to the front entrance to the parish parking lot. Another way to access our parking lot from the north is to take Woodridge Drive south (this is the stop light between Janes Avenue and 53rd) to Jonquil, where you will turn left. Jonquil ends at Chestnut, where you will follow the road, curving right. You can then access the parking lot to the left.

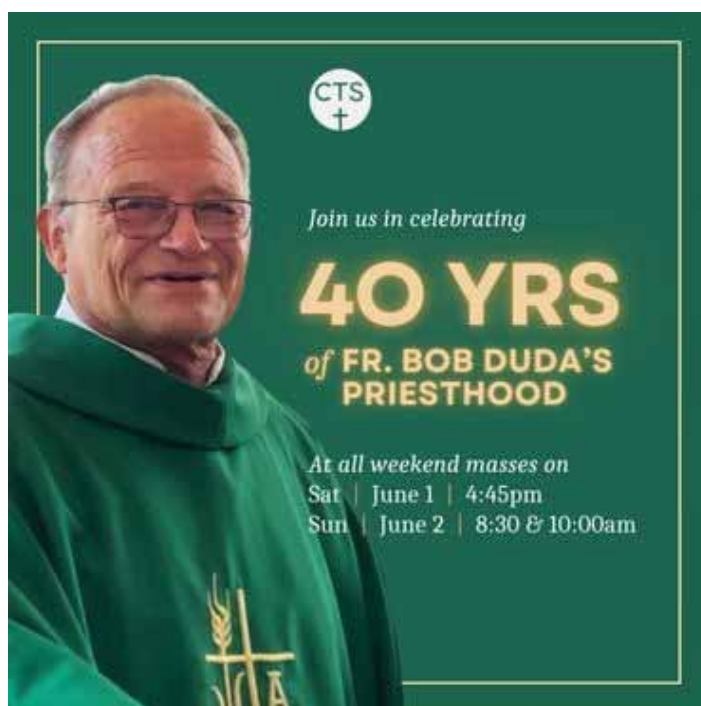

Thank you to you and your church for your very generous donation. We so appreciate your help.

On behalf of all those who received one of the packets and the recipients of those cards and letters, we say Thank You! These little gestures of loving concern do make a difference.

This is how one woman expressed her gratitude for the packet she received?

"I pray this finds you all and your families at home in good health and spirit. Today, April 10th, we were blessed with beautiful greeting cards to send to our loved ones at home. I do thank you for thinking about us here, the incarcerated. It means a lot. God bless you, keep you, shine His face on you and multiply your blessings."

This year we distributed almost 5150 packets to women, men and youth imprisoned in 17 jails and prisons. These packets had the potential for reminding 25,750 people that they were remembered and that there are people who care.

It is not too soon to start planning for our Christmas card project. Would your group be willing to host a Christmas in July (or later) party to sign cards? Contact us. We will help you set it up. Note that postage costs are probably increasing again July 1st. Buy stamps before that happens.

For next Mother's Day, we will need:

- #Blank and Thinking of You cards. Remember we have limited use of any cards with glitter or anything glued or pasted on them. Also, prisons are now banning cards/envelopes with messages written with marker or crayon
- #Golf sized pencils without an eraser
- #Zip lock bags
- #Lunch bags – be sure they are at least 5 1/8" by 3 1/8" by 10 5/8"

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Do you realize that the sign of the cross serves as an abbreviated form of the Apostles' Creed? Touching our forehead, breast, and shoulders (and in some cultures, our lips as well), we declare our belief in the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Every time we begin and end a prayer with the sign of the cross, we celebrate our belief in the Most Holy Trinity!

Also, we are still focusing on the Nationwide Eucharistic Revival. For this journey, the USCCB reserved Corpus Christi Sunday 2022 through Pentecost 2025.

Another worldwide Catholic event has been taking place over the past couple of years and will culminate in a synod in Rome this October. The Synod on Synodality is Pope Francis's initiative for the Catholic Church to collaboratively chart its path in the modern era, emphasizing listening, discernment, and mission.

The following prayer is a slightly modified version of one put forth by the Vatican. Please pray in thanksgiving and petition for all we have and all we look forward to.

- † Come, You who make all things new!
- † Come, Holy Spirit, soul of the Church: gather into unity and make fruitful the toil, the hope, and the desire of each one involved in the Synod and the Eucharistic Revival, we invoke you.
- † Come, gentle Breath of God, who in Jesus revives the dwindling flame, and restore vigor to the bruised reed, we call upon you.

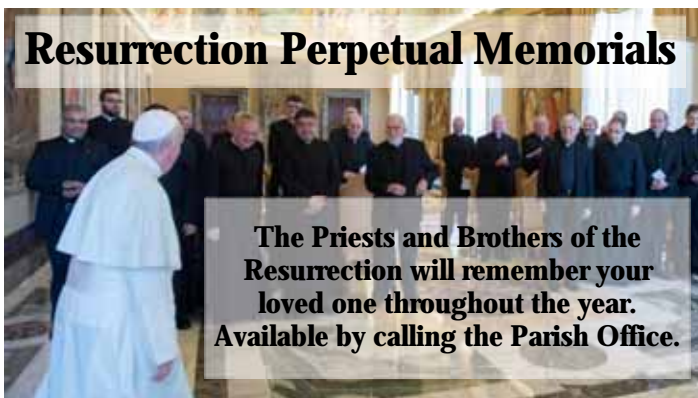
