# Christian Education Commission

### Confirmation

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults provides a process for high school age and adults to prepare for the Sacraments of Initiation that includes participation in rituals, attending classes, and scripture study within the context of the Catholic faith community. ## Christian Worship Commission

The purpose of the Worship Commission is to develop the spiritual and liturgical life of the parish community. Contact: Kurt Meyer, Director of Music, at 630.985.2351, ext. 140.

### Art and Environment Committee

Designs and sets up the liturgical decorations in the church, narthex, and breezeway for each season. Artistic people, people who can sew and iron, as well as people who are able to climb ladders and move heavy objects are needed.

#### **Altar Servers**

Students in grades 5 through 8 serve at weekend Masses, Holy Day Masses, and funerals. Training takes place in the fall and spring.

### Crossbearers

Carry the wooden cross in the opening and recessional processions. Training is offered once a year or by appointment.

### **Eucharistic Ministers**

Trained and commissioned to minister the Body and Blood of Christ to the faithful. Training is offered once a year or by appointment.

### Lectors

Trained and commissioned to proclaim the Word of God to the faithful. Training sessions occur in the fall.

### **Mass Coordinators**

Set up the sacred vessels before the Mass and check to see that all of the ministers are in place. The "behind the scenes" workers who make sure everything we see during the Mass goes smoothly. Training is ongoing.

### Ministers of Hospitality/Ushers

Greet the faithful as they arrive for Mass. Ushers are responsible for the collection, assisting during the Communion Procession, and handing out bulletins at the end of Mass. Training is ongoing.

### **Music Ministers**

Share their vocal or instrumental talents in one or more of our musical groups to enhance the prayer experience of the assembly at worship. Adult Choir, Youth Choir (grades 3-8), Contemporary Ensemble, Resurrection Choir, Instrumental Ensemble, and Handbell Choir.

# Christian Service Commission

Our goal is to help families, most often mothers with children, make the transition from being homeless, and often jobless, to becoming self-sufficient, through mentoring and support.
