
SCHEDULING ACTIVITIES

On October 20, we celebrate World Mission Sunday, when we join Catholics worldwide in supporting the missionary work of the Church. Pope Francis draws inspiration from the wedding story for the theme of this year's World Mission Sunday: **"Go and invite everyone to the banquet"** (cf. **Mt 22:9**). In his message, Pope Francis invites us to set our hearts ablaze with faith and put our faith into action, serving God's mission with joy, enthusiasm, and tireless dedication:

1. **"Go and invite"**—As Christians, we're called to take part in this universal mission by offering his or her won witness to the Gospel in every context, so that the whole Church can continually go forth with her Lord and Master to the "crossroads" of today's world.

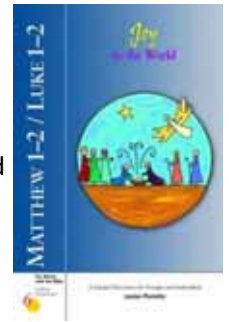

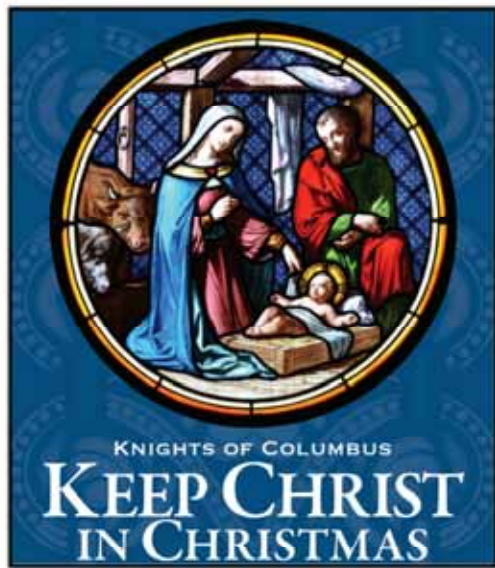

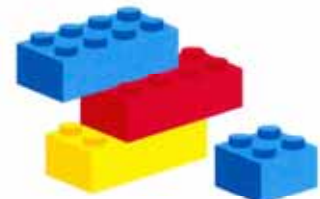
