










Prayer for the Return of Non-practicing Catholics



Prayer for Labor Day

Dear Lord,

Bless and protect the men and women whose hard work provides food and shelter to them and their families, services to our communities, and care to our world. Be with them as they work, but also as they rest and recreate in Your care.

Amen © LPi Eucharistic Adoration is an opportunity for us to pray to Jesus Christ before the Eucharist. St. Scholastica Parish offers the chance to pray to Jesus in this way on the first Monday of every month from 1 to 5 p.m. Closing Benediction starts at 5 p.m.



Regular Adoration-goers are familiar with Adoration terms and procedures. First-time and newer Adoration-goers may not be. I offer this information as a refresher:

Monstrance The vessel in which Jesus is exposed. Here, we adore Our Lord. It is usually in the shape of a cross or a cathedral to represent the throne of the Son of God. The sunburst design not only directs our attention, but also shows us that the light of Jesus shines from the sacrament. The monstrance is made of gold because it contains something truly precious: the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ.

Exposition The part of Adoration in which Jesus is brought out from the tabernacle to be exposed in the monstrance. During this time, we kneel and pray the O Salutaris Hostia.

Adoration The most powerful private prayer in which we adore the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist. During this time people may choose to pray in different ways to show their love for Jesus. At the end of this time, we kneel and pray the Tantum Ergo.

Benediction When the minister is a priest or deacon, he may process with the monstrance or raise it up to show us that we are truly blessed as Catholics to have Christ so truly present in our midst.


Reposition The end of Eucharistic Adoration. The minister leads The Divine Praises and then returns Christ to the tabernacle. Afterwards, we all sing Holy God, We Praise Thy Name.

I didn't grow up knowing about or practicing Eucharistic Adoration. I was introduced to Perpetual Adoration by a friend and prayed with Jesus in this way at Visitation Parish, Elmhurst. Later I was invited to Eucharistic Adoration by my now husband, Terry, at Saints Peter and Paul, Naperville. For many years, my dad and I made every Thursday-before-First-Friday Benediction at St. Alexander in Palos Heights. It was a very special time.

Please consider spending this special time each first Monday at St. Scholastica.

What is OCIA? It is a process which adults become members of the Roman Catholic Church. This consists of steps, periods, and rites that make up the model of Christian Initiation as restored in the second Vatican

If you or someone you know answers YES to any of these questions you are invited to find out more through a process called Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA). It is a journey that begins with your questions. We look forward to meeting you and answering you questions starting NOW to help you discern if you would like to join our OCIA sessions begin this coming Fall, 2024.

Statistics show that most people respond to a personal invitation. Consider this notice a personal invitation if you are interested in inquiring about the beauty, truth, and goodness of the Holy Catholic Church. We want to talk to you! Please contact Alison Chandler.

To our St. Scholastica Parishioners. In the early church the whole community welcomed and evangelized newcomers. The responsibility to catechize was shared by all in the community. Through Vatican Council II we have restored this earlier model of invitation and now rely on the parish community to be catechists, sponsors, leaders, and pray for all. Maybe, God is calling you to join our team of Teachers, Parish sponsors/mentors, and journey with us through the 2024-2025 OCIA process.
