
As a welcoming people, with Jesus as our foundation, we are the Catholic Community of St. Scholastica Parish.

The Silver Rose comes to St. Scholastica

The Silver Rose is a symbol of devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe. The rose was chosen to commemorate Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses, an important part of the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe. A silver version of the rose circulates every year throughout the dioceses of Illinois. It came to the Diocese of Joliet from the Archdiocese of Chicago. When it left the Joliet Diocese, it was taken to the Diocese of Peoria, where it will circulate among parishes of that diocese.

On the morning of August 26th, Pastor Mark Cote celebrated Mass in Honor of the Silver Rose, a symbol of devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe. The Rose came to St. Scholastica from St. Francis of Assisi Parish, and at the end of Mass, it was taken to St. Raphael Parish for an evening service on that same day. Due to the connection of the Knights of Columbus to the Silver Rose, an Honor Guard was present for the Mass. It was made up of three Sir Knights, two of whom were members of St. Scholastica Knights of Columbus Council 5918. Besides adult parishioners, several classes from St. Scholastica School experienced the morning service.

Fr. Mark's homily talked about Our Lady of Guadalupe and the meaning she has in our lives. As he was speaking, he pointed to the large image of Our Lady of Guadalupe at the back of the Altar.




A Prayer for Catechists
